## Do you like to sing?

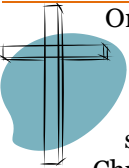

At one of our Lenten Dinners and ELCA World Hunger discussions, Karen Idler shared about the topic of ‘food deserts’. We often go to our local grocery



store and see aisles of fresh produce and don't think we have food deserts in our area. The people who are served by St. Vincent de Paul fall into the food desert category. St. Vincent de Paul partners with many organizations who serve food, but many of the meals are processed foods and don't contain fresh fruits and vegetables. Through our latest development with Feeding the Hungry, our congregation is moving to help those in need in this area of nutritional meals. Terri Batsel and her husband are turning their farming area into a community garden. Led by Ellen Deutsche, who has a background in nutrition, people (adults and children) harvest the food. A team from Resurrection, then delivers the produce to St. Vincent de Paul's to have on hand as clients and servers want the produce. It is an exciting development in this missional area.

In April, more than 30 members of the congregation accepted an invitation to visit the SALAM Center and were treated to a wonderful experience. SALAM is the acronym of Sacramento Area League of Associated Muslims. The group was hosted by Dr.



Metwalli Amer, Co-founder of the Center. After refreshments, Dr. Amer explained the history of SALAM'S inception and development and then offered a presentation on the *Common Ground Among Judaism, Christianity and Islam*. A tour of the Center followed with the administrative facilities, the library (which is

open to all in the community) and the school. The highlight of the tour was the experience of hearing the Call to Prayer in the mosque and sharing the richness of this inter-faith communion.

**The Women's Retreat – Mother, Martyr or Mystic?** – was held in Auburn on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> and was a great day. El Toyon Center is in a beautiful location and is a lovely facility that accommodated the group well. Even the weather cooperated. With her thought-provoking guidance, the group was lead to explore new ideas and new ways to interact as women in a community of faith.

### Going GREEN Update!

A solar task team has been looking at the feasibility of going solar for over four months, learning how we can use the power of God's sun to enhance the ministry at Resurrection. The plan has been approved by finance, and council. **A special meeting of the congregation will be held on June 12<sup>th</sup>** at 10:30 a.m. in the Faith Center where your vote will be needed for final approval. The last informational Q&A presentation is planned for Sunday, **June 5<sup>th</sup>** - (9:15, 10:45 & 12:45 – Room 10).

Briefly, by installing solar we can reduce our annual power bill from \$29,500 to near zero, replace the Faith Center roof and pay off the loan required to build the system. ## From Stalinist Russia to Resurrection

Imagine that before you graduated from high school your father was executed by Stalin's henchmen and you were ripped away from your home as a refugee during World War II, only to wind up back under communism in East Germany after the war.

That's the early life story of Resurrection member **Erich Sawatzky**. But fortunately things got a lot better after that. Sawatzky earned a Ph.D. in Canada before moving to San Jose for a long career with IBM before retiring to Roseville with his wife, Georgia, in 2000.



His ancestors emigrated from Germany to Russia beginning in the late 1700's to colonies in what is now Ukraine, invited by the tsars to settle the fertile but underpopulated region. Their descendants lived in these settlements for more than a century, speaking German, practicing Lutheranism, and generally being left alone by the Russian authorities. By the 1930's, there were about 300,000 ethnic Germans in the region.

Sawatzky was born in 1934 in the small village of Warwarowka, about 200 miles west of Kiev. Four years

later, as millions of Russians suspected of being disloyal to the ruthless Soviet dictator were executed or sent to labor camps in Siberia, a knock came on the family's door in the middle of the night.

"In October of 1937, the Soviet NKVD (the predecessor to the KGB) came to our house, abducted my father, and up to her death my mother and even my brother did not know what happened to him. Five years ago, I discovered through a genealogy association on the Internet that in December of 1937 my father was executed by firing squad." [Read more...](#)

## "Spring Fling" Annual Meeting Highlights

On Sunday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>, Resurrection held its first spring Annual Meeting since changing to the fiscal year of July 1 through June 30. With over 150 folks in attendance, our "Spring Fling" provided the opportunity to review and celebrate the successful conclusion of the "Imagine What God Can Do" capital funding appeal. We were entertained with special music by the "Track 23" Blues Band and enjoyed a delicious lunch catered by Hickory Hank's BBQ as a way of saying "thank you" to the congregation for their incredible generosity.

During the meeting, children and teens played games and had a great time in the bounce houses. The meeting got underway with the election by “acclamation” of two new council members, John Frith and Connie Losk. Appreciation was expressed to the four members ending their terms – John Wickeraad, Eric Msechu, Le Viksten and Linda Waage. A special note of thanks was given to John Wickeraad for his service as Council President, Chair of the “Imagine” appeal, and his continuing service in other ministry areas.

#### Action items included:

- Highlights of Pr. Sandra Dager’s Worship & Music consultation findings as well as a summary of the Mission Assessment Profile Survey (MAP) from the fall 2015.
- A ministry staffing update highlighting the additions of Karen Idler, (Director of Shared Ministry); Mark Weaver (Director of Teen Ministry); Dee Dee Lutz (Director of Worship and Music); Adriana Findlay (Director of Children’s Ministry) and Chris Cotter (Audio/Visual Administrator).
- The adoption of the 2016-2017 spending plan.
- A review of the 2016-17 Ministry Objectives established by the Church Council and staff.
- A slideshow and video highlights of Capernaum Week special needs camp held during Holy Week at Resurrection shared by Mark Weaver and three of our teens.
- A Solar power task force report regarding their research into the feasibility of Resurrection converting to solar power.

#### May Church Council Highlights

- Council heard proposals from two consultants to work with us during our Listening Phase, most likely starting this fall. (After the Imagine campaign, we’ll be listening to our community and considering where best to place our energies next and do ministry together.) We received follow-up information via email from both and will be choosing one of them soon.
- Council also heard a presentation from Ed Babcock on Solar Power. Ed also made this presentation for the congregation at the May 22 Annual Meeting. There will be more information sessions on this topic before the congregation votes whether to go ahead. Over the next 20 years, anticipated savings with solar is more than \$350,000. Council thanks members of the solar task force for their work so far: Ed Babcock, Skip Donelson, and Ron Becker.
- Pastor Ralph reports. We confirmed three young people and responsibility for Teen Ministry has finished transitioning from him to Mark Weaver. Ralph has been working with Cynthia Wellington and Michelle Larsh on social ministry outreach. He is also preparing for upcoming academic classes.
- Pr Don reports. We have Sandra Dager’s finished report on Worship and Music. Wonderful to have new staff coming on:
  - DeeDee Lutz, Director of Music and Worship

- Adriana Findlay, Director of Children’s Ministry
- Chris Cotter as our AV Systems Administrator
- We may make changes to benefits for pastors and staff to lower cost to the congregation while increasing the benefits to individuals.
- Council passed a change to our personnel policy on volunteer qualifications. It will be more flexible and also more compliant with our insurance provider’s expectations.
- Synod Assembly June 3-5. We are sending Pr. Don, Pr. Ralph, Karen Idler, John Crostic, Lynne Gregoire, Len Merkel, Barbara Merkel, and Jane Stevens.
- Annual meeting May 22. Connie Losk and John Frith running unopposed for 2 spots.
- Thanks to outgoing Council members John Wickeraad, Linda Waage, Eric Msechu, and Le Viksten.

#### Still Life Goes On

*"Bear fruit in every good work." - Col. 1:10b*

Crouched over the vines, we looked for red. Scanning rows of strawberries, the lesson was not to pick too soon. There's a moment in the ripeness of fresh fruit, and at the right time, we do well to pluck. As a little one, close to the ground, I fished hungrily through the leaves. But after a while, I grew weary, and at some point I'd switch from plucking to collecting. Standing (or sitting) in the center of the row, arms out, I'd await everyone else's deposits to my basket, with the thrill of wonder to see what they would share.

"Bear fruit" the Apostle says. Our actions do this bearing of fruit. In all that we do, we hold a basket of fruit into which we and the others around us make an offering. At the end of the day, we take stock, we check the yield. Our assessment isn't neutral; we need what we bear. It is the spiritual food on which we survive. With good fruit, we know exactly what to do. We are thankful. We eat lustily and are strengthened for the journey. But what do we do with the fruit that disappoints? Like the friend we desperately need who

just . . . vanishes. Or the confidant who pushes advice we neither need nor want. Worse still, the one who betrays us. This is all indigestible fruit.

"Bear fruit in every good work," Paul says. But not all works are good. Not all people are prepared to hand us the fruit we want or need at the moment. Pray. Look in your basket. See the fruit of God's people. With God's grace, know what to do with each piece.

**Prayer:** God, help us to bear good fruit. When we don't, help us to know better than to share it. And, when others give us fruit that we cannot take, help us to know better than to eat it. Amen.
